Bradninch Acoustic Music Club is thrilled to invite back Nikki Sutton and Terry Murray to entertain us with songs penned by the masters of Swing, Jazz, Bossa Nova and Pop - Gershwin, Irving Berlin, Cole Porter, Duke Ellington, Antonio Carlos Jobim, to name a few - songs made famous by the wizardry of Ella Fitzgerald, Billie Holiday, Julie London, Nina Simone, Peggy Lee...the list goes on. Stir in some more contemporary numbers with a Jazz feel and the dish is complete.

Nikki started out fronting Blues/R&B bands in Brighton, moving to Bristol in the early 90s. With a lifelong love of harmony, Nikki was delighted to join the all female a cappella group, Sweet Soul Sisters who toured the UK and Europe, recorded an album, broadcast for the BBC, and played regularly at the Glastonbury Festival. They launched our CD 'Freshly Squeezed' at a special 10-day showcase at the Canadian Vancouver Fringe Festival.

On meeting her husband guitarist Terry Murray, Nikki worked on musical projects including Jazz, Blues, Acoustic and Funk - but Jazz has been the dominating style. "I'm passionate when it comes to performing, especially with these great songs. I think of my voice and my tone as an instrument, I guess that's how I express myself. Over the past five years, I've been studying Jazz guitar too, which I think gives me more versatility."

Terry took up guitar at the age of 14, inspired by everything from Jimmy Hendrix & Eric Clapton to Django Reinhardt and Wes Montgomery. Originally playing in Blues & Rock bands moved into his first Jazz gigs with a local Hammond organist playing standards which "stole his heart!" He turned professional just after his 19th birthday and was lucky enough to hone his craft serving a musical apprenticeship in resident Mecca & Top Rank bands of the mid 70's and 80's, going on to live in Copenhagen playing in Jazz & Fusion bands.

Jazz and the art of improvisation are both their passions and love the live arena which brings the opportunity to interact with an audience and make it warm and personal.

# **Running on Empty**

At the beginning of September, Kier Starmer told us that "The NHS is broken but not beaten.....it requires major surgery not sticking plasters......there can be no investment without reform.....this is a 10 year project". What does this mean for us in Silverton and surrounding villages? We recognise the long wait for hospital appointments but we have an excellent surgery; Wyndham House recently ranked 13<sup>th</sup> out of the 6,311 GP practices in England in the 2024 GP Patient survey.

#### **Reduction of GP Resources**

It is true we do provide an excellent service. This is down to an enormous amount of hard work from our team at the surgery and also the fact that patients use the services we provide in a responsible way. However, we are not immune from the effects of what has been happening in the last twenty years within the NHS. Sadly, this is a story of hospital versus community healthcare. Since 2008 the proportion of NHS budget that has come to Primary Care services has dropped from 11% to 7%, the money being redirected to Secondary Care. The number of hospital doctors has increased by 30% whilst the number of GPs working in the UK has dropped by 10%. There has been an enormous exodus of recently trained GPs to work in Canada and Australia. 1,300 GP practices have closed due to the lack of resource they were given stacked against increasing demand and inflationary costs. Whilst the junior doctors have been awarded a 22% pay increase, investment in General Practice is 5% less than in 2018.

#### In the Top Fifteen

Last year the British Social Attitudes Survey showed a 29% decrease in patient satisfaction with the NHS over the previous four years. However, 85% of our population want a free at the point of delivery service and are happy to pay more tax to achieve this. Such a service needs a gatekeeper to ensure it is not overrun. This is one of our GP roles but it only works if we are able to provide continuity of care cradle to grave. Wyndham House is top fifteen of the rankings because we strive to provide such care but many GPs in the UK have not experienced the satisfaction and enormous health benefits it brings for both GP and patients. The evidence is clear; you live longer and go to hospital less if you know your GP.

### **Unwelcome Changes**

I am writing about this because we are having to make some changes that will affect patients to ensure we protect what we have. We take blood tests on behalf of the hospital however the funding for this work has never properly been transferred to us. We can no longer do this and so patients will be directed by the hospital to attend Whipton or Tiverton. We have had an open access ear syringing service however we will now only offer a limited number per week and create a waiting list. We will also need to limit appointments for travel advice. We have recently seen an increase in patients cancelling appointments at the last minute, this wastes valuable clinical time that other patients could have used.

From now on when this occurs we will be more direct about our disappointment and record it.

#### **Major Investment Required**

The truth for UK General Practice is that it is near to breaking; it requires major investment to re-establish its core infrastructure and there is not much time for the Government to do this.

# **Silverton Memory Cafe**

Dementia is not a single disease but an umbrella term for many different conditions which are all characterised by a decline in memory and cognitive function. The main risk factor is old age, though it can affect people who are younger.

Alzheimers is the most common form of dementia, affecting over fifty five million people worldwide, though there are many more people who are never diagnosed. For reasons not yet understood two thirds of people affected are women.

Recent studies have shown that life style changes, which include improved diet, exercise, sleep and a reduction in stress, can improve the outcome of people who have early cognitive impairment. Another important factor is social stimulation with activities which stimulate thoughts and brain function.

The worst situation is feeling alone and not communicating with other people. Human beings need each other for social interaction and stimulation. Dementia is a complex and challenging condition but it is not usually an inevitable part of growing older. The research is quite clear, we have the power to influence our brains future.

At the Memory Cafe, we aim to challenge our visitors with puzzles, games, singing and guizzes; plus there is always lots of happy chatter and communication which also brings a sense of companionship, enjoyment and fulfilment.

If you are worried about your memory or are on your own with little company, do drop in to join us on any Thursday afternoon between 2 and 4 pm in the Silverton Community Hall, where a warm welcome awaits you.



## 2 Year Strategic Plan 2024-26.

#### Introduction

This plan arose out of a Planning Day organised by the Trust. The Trust has undergone significant changes in personnel in recent months and we wanted to give ourselves the opportunity to sit down together and properly explore the history and aims of the Trust and devise a strategy that would best fit 21st Century Bradninch. With the excellent help of an external facilitator for Devon Communities Together we spent a whole day exploring these issues. This plan is the result of that. The full plan, which includes Actions and Progress so far, is available on the Town Trust website at www.bradninch.org.uk

The current Trustees are a newly formed group of local volunteers, the most recent of us joining just months ago. We have a good spread of ages and experience and we are committed to modernising the Trust while at the same time remaining true to its core principles. This new plan will inform how we go ahead with our work over the next couple of years. We hope you'll take time to have a look at it - we will always welcome comments and ideas as we move forwards, introducing new ideas and systems for managing the Trust as well as we can.

#### Context

This plan will guide decisions made by Trustees of the charities operating under the banner of "Bradninch Town Trusts."

There are currently five registered charities. Two of them have associated older charities within their Trust. Trustees are the same for all organisations.

This plan includes proposals to simplify the existing arrangements into two organisations with different but complementary objectives.

Bradninch Town Trust CIO has recently been created as a legal entity. Existing activities and assets of the older Bradninch Town Trust Charity may be



# Terracycle yet another update

Terracycle do an admirable job recycling the unrecyclable and are continually evolving what they can and cannot process. Much is dictated by their business model and the subsidise the manufacturers of the waste are willing to pay.

It seems an almost regular update but the arrangement between KP and Terracycle is ceasing end of November. So, we can **no longer take crisp and nut packets**. These can be taken to Tescos and other supermarkets.

To recap you can still dump the following in the big metal bin outside the Guildhall-

All **Biscuit**, **cake & Cracker** wrappers. These could include some sweet wrappers – e.g. Kitkat, Golf club etc – anything that may double as a biscuit/cake. **Pringle pots & tops** – only "Pringle" with a metal base – new ones can be recycled. **Cheese pouches** – any brand, e.g. Cathedral cheddar etc.

Ferrero Roche trays and inserts.

**Tooth brushes** and heads, but not toothpaste tubes. I do take Blister packs to Clare House surgery dispensary in Tiverton.
