Wishing you a Pink Christmas

The comforts and traditions associated with Christmas are enjoyable. The predictability gives us feelings of security. However, we have all experienced changes to our Christmas routines at various points in our lifetimes. Initially the change feels strange but then the new festive habits bed in and become the comfortable normal, until circumstances alter them again.

There is a similarity here with how we treat some medical conditions. We encourage patients to become comfortable with routines and patterns of symptoms. They learn how their bodies respond to medication and this provides them the security of knowing they have control over these symptoms. Asthma is the best example of this method of care.

The national guidelines for Asthma care are changing. They are now directing us to stop prescribing blue inhalers and replace them with a combination inhaler. Introducing this change will save lives; there are still a very large number of preventable asthma deaths across the UK.

The evidence shows that using a single inhaler (the surgery will use the pink Fostair inhaler) for almost all asthma patients greatly reduces the number of exacerbations patients experience, reduces hospital admissions and is a much better for the environment. Inhalers comprise 4% of the NHS Carbon footprint. Halving the number we use, plus using powder inhalers where possible, is on the same environmental scale as closing an international airport!

The combination inhaler contains a long acting 'reliever' (equivalent to the blue inhaler) and a small dose of steroid (equivalent to the previous brown inhalers). Inhaling both components at the same time is of great benefit for both short and long term control of asthma symptoms. The benefits are greatest for patients who previously only used a blue inhaler. You use the pink inhaler in the same way as the blue; it acts just as quickly, and the effect lasts a lot longer.

This is a very significant change for asthma patients; the security and reliability of their blue inhaler is deeply engrained over many years. Starting the brown inhaler alongside it if symptoms worsen is a firmly embedded learnt response. This is being replaced with simply increasing the number of pink inhalations. The new Single Inhaler regime does not change the thinking, it just removes the need for two inhalers and heightens the speed of response to the treatment.

We will start sending letters explaining the change to our asthma patients in December and so some might receive their first pink inhaler for Christmas. However, for the majority this will be in the New Year; a more traditional time to make changes and experience their benefits.

WW2 – 80 years events - Memories The 8th May 2025 marks 80 years since the cessation of another terrible conflict in Europe - VE Day. I have been through the transcripts and cannot find any particular references to what happened in Bradninch & Hele to celebrate the end of the war and the eventual return of our armed forces. I have been on-line and found a couple of newspaper articles detailing some community events and there are several newspapers from the time in Mr Nick's archive (not all make pleasant reading or viewing however), but it would be wonderful if we can capture as many people's memories and even images of the May events and even the VJ day in August.

An idea is to have a small exhibition in the Guildhall especially over the weeks around the 8th and into the Musical Gardens weekend.

Devon County Council all-party protest to plans to cut funding for rural communities

It costs councils more to provide public services in rural counties - our bill for getting children to school, for example, is one of the highest in the country.

Previously, there has been a Rural Service Delivery Grant for local councils in rural areas, to help fund those increased costs. Devon's received £10.1 million from the grant this year - the highest in the region.

But the government has announced plans to repurpose the grant, and instead to target funds to deprived areas.

It means that we will have to cut £10 million from our operating costs and from the money we were expecting to spend next year.

So, the council has agreed to write to government, urging them to provide more cash in Devon's overall grant settlement, which we're expecting to hear about this month, to mitigate the £10 million loss.



APPLICATION FORM FOR GRANT AID 2025

Bradninch Town Council would like to hear from any organisation in the Town which feels they would benefit from a Grant of up to £250. To be eligible, the organisation must: be based in the Town have a constituted management group have a bank account in the name of the organisation demonstrate that any Grant funding received will benefit the wider Town community demonstrate that they are providing a service and/or improving the environment and/ or enhancing the quality of life and/or improving recreation and/or sporting activities for local residents demonstrate how any Grant funding from the previous year has been utilised submit both a copy of this fully completed application form and an organisational bank statement issued within the preceding 3 months to the Clerk via the above contact details no later than 5pm on 31st January 2025.

Application forms will be accepted from 1st December 2024. They will be reviewed by the Town Council in March 2025 and applicants will be notified of the outcome as soon as possible thereafter. Only one application per organisation will be considered in any financial year. Priority will be given to organisations which have not previously received Grant funding and in response to requests for capital costs which are deemed to offer the greatest benefit to the wider Town community.

If successful, the organisation: will receive their Grants via BACS into their organisation's bank account by May 2025 end must be prepared to evidence how the funding has been spent prior to 31st December 2025 must declare receiving Grant Aid support in any associated publicity.

They've also confirmed their wholehearted support for the council's own farms estate which aims to give people a start in agriculture.

cellor, Rachel Reeves, expressing its concerns about the inheritance tax policy, outlining the detrimental effect on the future of farming in Devon, food security, environmental stewardship and the need to sustain rural communities.

The motion was put forward by Councillor Lois Samuel, with an amendment added by Councillor Alan Connett.

Twelfth Night Lantern Parade and Bonfire

The Bradninch tradition of the Twelfth Night Lantern Parade and Bonfire will be held on Monday 6th January. The event will celebrate the end of Christmas and the start of the New Year by parading through the streets of the town with lanterns making as much noise as possible. There will be singing and morris dancing at The Guildhall before the town tree leads the parade, taking the old Christmas trees and lanterns to a big bonfire to be burnt. It is lots of fun and we hope you and your family will join in.

The Theme

This year's theme will be Elements - Earth, Wind, Fire and Water. Some eager lantern makers may choose to take their inspiration from the popular film 'Elemental'.

Lantern Making Workshops

Bring your family along to the lantern making workshops at The Guildhall on: Friday 27th, Saturday 28th and Sunday 29th December from 10.00 am until 4.00 pm.

Lanterns are easy to make and will probably take just a few hours to do (although yours can be as big and elaborate as you like!). All the bits and pieces that you will need will be provided and there will be grown-ups available to help you and to show you what to do. There will be a charge of £3.00 per lantern to cover the cost of the materials. All you need to bring is a jam jar lid, a pair of secateurs or scissors for cutting the willow and your imagination.

Lantern Parade and Bonfire

The parades will take place on **Monday 6th January** at 6.30 pm. One parade will start at the top of Townlands in West End Road and the other will start at the bottom of Hornbeam Gardens in Parsonage Street. They will be led by the Fire Giant and Water Giant. You can either join in at the start or join in as the parade passes you. The two parades will meet at The Guildhall at where there will be singing, and dancing from Bradninch Millers Morris. Everyone will be carrying their lanterns and noisy instruments and dragging their old Christmas trees along for the bonfire.

The parade will continue down Millway to the cricket club where there will be a big bonfire. The club house will be open and the Soup Dragons from Scouts promise some wonderful homemade soup.

If you don't want to drag your old Christmas tree along on the parade, you can drop it off at the football field on the afternoon of Monday $\mathbf{6}^{\text{th}}$ January – we would welcome a small donation to cover costs.

We hope to see you at the lantern making workshops and at the parade. Merry Christmas!

Bradninch Guest Night on Tuesday 20 February The Dilly Boys & Stompin' Dave in support.

It may be cold outside, but Bradninch Folk Club's Guest Night at the Bradninch Guildhall on Tuesday 20 February will keep you warm and moving. Two lively acts, The Dillyboys and Bridport's powerhouse of performance Stompin' Dave.



The Dillyboys are an energetic folk band, combining the banjo, accordion, violin, guitar and voices to create their foot stomping folk sound. The band comprise Emily Howard - guitar and accordion, Lizi Ben-nett – violin and Dave Parry – banjo. The band play a mixture of Irish, English, and Americana folk songs and tunes, plus some of their own original songs, and a few pop covers. Previously seen at the Bradninch Music Festival this will be a chance to meet the band up close for a lively, rambunctious vibrant show with a strong focus on audience participation. The band are bringing their own support guest for the night Stompin' Dave in a solo performance, the man who does more than a hundred gigs a year as solo, duo up to full band. Stompin' Dave performs a broad spectrum of vintage style music including blues, bluegrass, classical, country, folk, jazz, rock n roll, and old time. Dave is a phenomenal artist. A great guitar player and vocalist, an accomplished songwriter and an excellent traditional fiddler, a boogie/blues piano player and a competition standard five-string banjo picker. As if that's not enough, he is also an outstanding dancer using a combination of flatfoot and clogging styles often when playing one of his stringed instruments.

BRADFOLK on the first Tuesday of the month in the Castle Hotel, is an open music in the round session for performers, people joining in the chorus or just listening and appreciating live music, songs, and poetry, the first one of the year is on 2 January 2024 and has no door charge.

Update. The deadline for submitting copy to the magazine enables me to comment on the 16 January Guest Night with Geoff Lakeman and Rob Murch. As billed, Geoff and Rob fully entertained the audience with skill and wit, both artists and audience had a good evening. The event was watched by 46 people including the two support artists, Martyn Beed and Graham Butterfield, plus Rob Reeves and myself Gerard Edwards. I was asked what the proportion of the audience were visiting folkies, I was able to confirm that it was about 1/3, which means local people make up a healthy 2/3 of the audience. This will include a proportion of folkies, but the importance of this proportion and the steady growth which has built it up demonstrate that the entertainment has a wide appeal to people, and they have created a safe and friendly space. The fact that some people are prepared to travel relatively long distances to see acts at Bradninch is a validation of the artist performing. The audience also get a recommendation from artist as many have shared that Bradninch is a welcoming audience.


Bradninch Town Council Representative on the Town Trust - Vacancy


